### SUMMARY

**John 1:6** "They have told the church about your love" ...

Dr. Anthony W. Bailey was named Senior Pastor of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church in November 2016. Pastor Bailey and his wife, Lady Andrea Bailey, and sons Brandon and Nicholas Bailey joined the Mount Pleasant family. They were welcome with open arms and hearts by the congregation. This review covers years of 2017 – 2021 as the first five years after Pastor Bailey took the pulpit at the church.

Sunday after Sunday, he has delivered an inspiring, thoughtprovoking, bible-validated sermon to congregants. He is referred to as the "People's Pastor." He does not mind rolling up his sleeves and getting his hands dirty on any project or work with a ministry on their needs. He has been seen painting the walls of the basement classrooms, clearing clutter from the storage rooms, cleaning the cemetery, sitting in on scholarship ministry meetings and helping the Deacons with congregant care plans. Pastor Bailey invites the kids into his office for snacks. Parents aside, the young people love it and relate to him.

He works diligently to welcome visitors and new members to the church. He encourages members to get involved, share ideas, and participate in the spiritual growth of the church. He has engaged new members to get involved with current ministries or create innovative ideas to involve the church with young people or in the community. A few examples include, Praise in the Park, with the Youth Minister, Michael Barrow, in 2021. During the height of the pandemic, MPBC Youth, got out into the community and shared love. Last Fall, Deanna Easley, and the Trailblazer team, put together a fun-filled day on the church grounds with vendors, praise dancers, a DJ, MPBC members, and many from the community. It was lots of fun and visibility. This event was inspired by Pastor Bailey's desire to minister beyond the church walls.

During his tenure, he has driven double-digit growth at the church, started new ministries, helped to launch community partnerships, and gotten the Mount Pleasant name visible in Wake and surrounding counties. He set a strategy at the start of his pastoral journey. He let God guide his walk and has seen remarkable success against the goals that he set for the church. Below are the major successes during the five years covered in this report.

MPBC Leadership Script Summary by:

This sounds farfetched, but I commit this plan to God. I am committed to walk with him and guide those who will follow. The goal is a greater understanding of Christ and how he can bring salvation and change for his glory and to benefit one's whole life.

SPLASH drives my vision for growth. God is love. When people see their family in Christ treating each other with God-inspired love, they are more inspired to seek a better understanding of Christ. Through his mission, word, and plans for salvation, personal growth happens, and our church grows too. I laid out the plans and I am leaving the rest to God.

During the last five years, God has shown me how his people are coming through the doors of Mount Pleasant. Each week we have new visitors and on-going growth in new members. New Members keep our church viable while mixing the old with the new, we have a unique combination of members to sustain us into the future. Our future is destined for greatness. We have the location, ministries, financial foundation, and spiritual love to get there. As we SPLASH into new areas, we are poised to be better than the past and embrace an exciting future to bring new souls to know God.

### SPRITUAL SUCCESS

Our spiritual success is dependent on "love" as the agape love taught by Christ, being deep in his word through our bible study and church sermons, embrace the bible as our guide for living inside and outside the church, helping the poor inside and outside the church through our homeless and many missions, and constant prayer for understanding, empathy, and growth in our spiritual walk with God. My personal measure is how many people can I get to know and commit to a life with Christ. I do this through my teaching, sermons, prayers, and most importantly my daily actions. The teaching of love, honesty, integrity, humbleness, and action for Christ drives my heart and my commitment as the Pastor of Mount Pleasant Baptist Church. In the last five years, I have been dedicated to SPLASHING in our church and through the community. I have opened myself up to members through my visits, communications, and personal attentiveness when faced with a need. Plus, I share my time with the community through meeting people where they are, my board work at, Family Promise, with the homeless, participating in seminars and meetings that are relevant to our church and the community.

### OPERATIONAL SUCCESS

During the first few years at Mount Pleasant, I was focused on understanding the plans, policies, practices, bylaws, and operational activities at the church. During my first year, I focused on understanding where we were, how we operated, and to identify areas to make us better.

I spent time with the Deacons. We created an ongoing monthly meeting to discuss and make decisions. We documented the meetings and set plans for action. I worked with the ministries to understand what each of them were doing and developed handbook manuals for ministry participation. I looked for critical policies and practices to operate effectively and as a church. This review included understanding the financial achievements of the church, our giving policy in benevolence, creating plans for how the buildings are used and a protocol for order of services on Sunday morning.

All of this was meant to get us on a common accord to better communicate, operate, and focus on the spiritual aspect of our church. While we are not a perfect church, we aim to do things that are right and in order. From the increase in computer technology for finance, administration, and to the sound booth, our improved windows, exterior beautification, and access via our elevator, we are trending in the right direction with our church operations. This is 'work in process' for all to keep innovating and improving the way we operate, to allow us to focus on Christ above all.

New Leadership: This Journey Begins in 2016

- Membership growth: Membership has more than doubled to over 242 members.
- 2. Minister's seeking MPBC home: Tripled from two to six.
- Deacons: We continue to look for additional leaders. We added brother Rod Gooch in 2022.
- We revamped the Deacon's monthly meeting, decision effectiveness, and actions with documented accountability plus frequent communication and collaboration with me. We have forged a strong working partnership for the benefit of Mount Pleasant.
- 5. I have had on-going mentoring to add new Deacons to Mount Pleasant.
- 6. I created a church vision, strategy, and plans that I have executed on for the last five years. This year, we will update our strategy plans for the next 5 years. Our current strategy has served us well to this point, but it is time to go to even greater heights here at MPBC.
- 7. I introduced bible lecture events and story tellers, plus supported the Deacons to bring in a top recording artist, Luther Barnes to our church for a successful night of music for our members. Honors go to Deacon Julious Scott for executing the concert plans perfectly. This is a notable example of collaboration between the Deacons and me.






- 8. I revamped the music ministry with new musicians, directors and supported choir education and enablement. Our current, Director of Music Scott Garris, brought innovative contemporary music each Sunday and he continues to add glory to our praise moments at the church.
- 9. I updated the Trustee ministry, added new members, and guided them to a new mission and sets of actions. The Trustee ministry is my partner in the beautification and maintenance at the church. They led the resurfacing of the parking lot, new windows, painting, carpeting, and grounds updates.
- 10. I advised the First Aid (newly renamed Health and Wellness ministry). Today, they are a strong set of members, well trained, and operating effectively during a time where we needed their leadership for the pandemic and church reopening.
- 11. I added the Homeless initiative to the Missions of the church and joined the board of Family Promise, to bring MPBC into the community and close to the action that we care about.
- 12. I spent numerous hours visiting the nursing home, sick and shut-in, and taking communion to those who are unable to attend church.
- 13. I added documents, clarity, and policy to our benevolence giving, fiscal management, cemetery, and church usage for activities and programs. This helps us operate with less confusion and with understanding.
- 14. I led the Deacons with local Developers to get agreement that once the property is developed, MPBC would keep the parking and get a water sewer connection. The Developers have continued to change so some of these actions are slowly coming to fruition. However, I as the Pastor of Mount Pleasant have been out front advocating for the church. I hosted the developers at the church, attended meetings downtown, and had numerous one on one meetings with previous developers. God's will be done as it relates to this. I know and am prayerful that whatever happens next door, it will be for the good of God.
- 15. I worked with the Deacons on approvals and Trustees on numerous church beautification and maintenance updates during the last five years; (not an all-inclusive list) some include ... new carpet through the church, elevator, parking lot paving, new windows in the basement, updated classrooms, reduced clutter in the basement, grass cutting









and beautification in the cemetery, also an updated sound systems, booth, internet, and air conditioning. Keeping our church looking good may not seem like a Pastor's role, but I believe if we look good for God, we can focus on being good for God.

- 16. I led an (external) financial review of the Church's financial posture and worked with the financial team to update the needed plans. I am immensely proud of our finance team. They have kept us financially sound during the years, by prudent management of our money, expert budgeting, and sound money management. We are in a good place financially. It is my desire that we stay strong in this area.
- 17. I added website support to allow us to communicate when not at church. This worked well as a great tool for us during the pandemic. Today, the website is a major part of my communication strategy. In addition to information, we have added ways that members and nonmembers can donate when not at church. This has contributed to significant income flow during the times of closure.
- 18. I Focused on the Ministries by adding a director to support ministry needs, plus created handbooks, policies, and pushed for financial clarity.
- 19. I awarded students with college scholarships from Mount Pleasant. Each year, we make a 'big deal' of our student graduates. This shows the important priority that I put into the next generation of members and leaders. These young people are our future. I am honored to see them move successfully from home to school and have Mount Pleasant play a small role in cheering them into the world.
- 20. Most importantly, I have delivered sermons that inspired more young people, adults, and new families to join Mount Pleasant. My most vital role here as Senior Pastor, is to deliver God's word. His word saves souls and inspires love for Christ. I am so proud to bring a "word" from God as he has inspired my steps and plans to get "all of us" to this point of success.

During the start of the Pandemic, delivering the word became a challenge. But in God's world, "where there is a will, there is a way. We made a way for the Word to come into the homes through the wonders of technology and YouTube TV, also via the radio at park and praise services, and finally through diligent health protocols to reopen church in 2021.

21. With a Loving heart for the community, we have reached out and made ourselves visible in the community from the

Youth programs with praise in the park, homeless initiatives, fun fall festivals, ministries for women in July and January, to our bible school programs during the summer for kids and adults. I've been progressive in supporting great ideas from the ministries and congregation.

- 22. I have endorsed numerous missions in our church the last five years. We have an outreach through our dynamic Missions ministry or programs like Notes-in-the-Pockets, 2<sup>nd</sup> Chance Sunday, Breast Cancer Awareness Sund, Prayer Vigils for the Community, feeding the homeless in downtown Raleigh, Family Promises, and Voting outreach.
- 23. The health and wellness have been an important focus in our church during my five-year tenure. With congregation leaders, I brought in Dr. Darks who is a noted doctor in the Raleigh-metro area. The doctor shared insights on how to navigate health challenges and best communication techniques with health professionals.
- 24. Holiday Fun is a part of our church's plan. We love God and we can laugh, sing, and have fun during the holidays. I have participated and endorsed, Christmas holiday parties and caroling, Valentines Dinners, and Resurrection "Easter" Sunday Breakfast.
- 25. We have an excellent group of Ministers in MPBC. Each year we celebrated the MPBC ministers with an appreciation. The Ministers of Mount Pleasant are honored with special recognition.





- Grew the Youth in the church by assigning a dedicated Minister to focus
  on children and youth initiatives. Minister Barrow and his team has
  developed an engaging set of plans and programs over the five years to
  keep the young people involved in the church.
- Financial Excellence has kept our church viable during the good times and the pandemic. I personally thank all members who kept giving when we were not able to be in church, but many of you continued to increase your giving year over year. This has allowed the church to operate at a surplus for all five years during my tenure. I worked with the finance to clarify roles and separate some duties so that we could operate more effectively. Our budget coordinator (Thelma Dublin-Evans), financial administrator (Georgia Lynch) and church treasurer (Julious Scott) have formed a powerful team under the new model. Thanks to them for keeping our church in great financial standing. We are grateful and blessed to be financially secure and independent.
- Partnered with the community to help and bring good visibility to our church. For the last five years, we have participated with Family Promise to host homeless families. Our church provided, money, meals, needed home items, communication and spiritual support where requested. I extended my time to this organization by joining their board to help lead from the round table. I am immensely proud of this partnership, plus our church's work through Missions (Dr. Rev. Linda Gill) at Notes in the Pocket, Prison Ministry, and Children's Homes in Oxford.

## WHAT'S NEXT

We have reflected over the five years from 2017 through 2021 with humble pride, joy, and many accomplishments. We have a lot to reflect on and to "thank God" for his grace and mercy. We have navigated the mission to spread his word and help others to know and see Christ through our actions.

The past is now a memory, but it is an effective guide to help direct us into a more glorious future with confidence and the security that God will order our steps.
